## African American Cultural Heritage Action Fund

The African American Cultural Heritage Action Fund provides grants ranging from \$50,000 to \$150,000. These grants are designed to advance ongoing preservation activities for historic places such as sites, museums, and landscape projects representing African American cultural heritage through grants to nonprofit organizations and government agencies.

The Action Fund supports projects focused on African American cultural heritage, and can include: Capital Projects, Organizational Capacity Building, Project Planning, and Programming and Interpretation

Grant awards will be announced in July 2021.

This year's deadline: African American Cultural Heritage Action Fund: January 15

## Opportunity for 2021-22:

National Trust funding is available exclusively to nonprofits and government agenciesl. The National Trust has many grant programs that may be of interest to you. email the National Trust Grants Department at <a href="mailto:grants@savingplaces.org">grants@savingplaces.org</a> or sign up to receive updates about grant funding.

Funding from the National Trust is awarded to nonprofit organizations and public agencies, and the majority of our funding is awarded for planning and education projects through our National Trust Preservation Funds grant program.

Grants are awarded annually in three competitive rounds: February 1, June 1, and October 1.

### Additional Upcoming Deadlines:

The National Park Service is now accepting applications for the following:

African American Civil Rights Grant Program, which supports documentation, survey, planning, education, interpretation, and oral history efforts as well as bricks and mortar preservation Applications for both <u>history projects</u> and <u>historic preservation projects</u> must be submitted by December 15, 2020.

Possible for 2021-22 Pincney Park?

History of Equal Rights Grant Program, which supports pre-preservation and preservation projects. <u>Applications</u> must be submitted by December 15, 2020.

Save America's Treasures grants, which support preservation and/or conservation work on historic districts, buildings, sites, and objects as well as collections, including artifacts, museum collections, documents, and works of art. Applications for both preservation grants and the collections grants must be submitted by January 26, 2021.
