



**History Commission Minutes**

**I. Call to Order**

Mayor Brook Lyon called the meeting to order at 6:00 pm.

Other Attendees: Mayor Brook Lyon, Mike Hemmer

Chair Michael Williams welcomed everyone and introduced newly appointed member Michael Corbo. Williams also noted this will be his last meeting as Chair due to his election to Town Council and that he hopes to continue attending as Council liaison.

**II. Election of Chair and Vice Chair**

After discussion, Williams made a motion to nominate Bill Lyon as Chair and Michael Corbo as Vice Chair, Inez Brown Crouch seconded; motion passed.

**VI. Reports:**

a. Town Market Outreach:

b. Historic Markers:

- First Baptist has been submitted (9/18/25).

For consideration

The Commission discussed the Sons of Elijah / 56 Men application.

Hemmer noted he discussed the application with Edwin Breeden of SCDAH and the application would have to be centered on the Lodge as the location. Mr. Breeden didn't think the "56 Men" portion would be more than a paragraph on one side. Michael Williams motioned to proceed with the application, but try to get a write-up from Mr. Victor Williams so the marker can be influenced in the "56 Men" direction; seconded by Bill Lyon; motion approved.

c. Special Projects:

Michael Williams noted he will continue to work on clean-up groups for marker sites; likely prioritizing Battery Cheves as the next clean-up.
