Minutes: History Council Meeting October 12, 2021

- Meeting called to order at 6:06PM Tuesday, October 12, 2021

- Minutes of previous meeting of History Council accepted
- A contractor had to be found to 'replant' the Dills Bluff historic marker. Possible relocation of marker may be necessary.
- Affirmation the June 10, 1862 historical marker was submitted to Archives & History
- Archives & History responded to the letter questioning the location if the WWII wartime location of Camp 8, of the CAP. Hedden will respond.
- The Town logo was accepted as the logo to be used to mark the History Trail
- It was determined the Town of James Island would provide the tent and chairs needed at Fort Johnson on November 7 (Stamp Act Remembrance Day).
- Melissa Dority suggested by an Historical Marker for Three Trees School be researched that would encompass the black schools that were on James Island during the Jim Crow era.
- Paul Hedden suggested the property that is now Pinckney Park have its history researched.
- Hedden suggested that a coordinating group be formed to work to make the James Island History Booklet coordinate with marker placement along the JI History Trail Jim Morrisette volunteered to be on the committee.
