II Approval of Minutes

B Arbor Day

- 1 Scheduled for Camp Road Middle School on December 1.
- 2 Tree planting plans
 - i Mark Johnson and Garrett Milliken will pick up trees.
 - ii Auckland Nursery is providing two 25 gallon live oaks and one 15 gallon magnolia as a cost of \$285.
 - iii With approval of David Parler, principal, a landscape plan has been devised.
 - (a) Inez Brown Crouch asked about flowers

- (b) Blooming plants may be added in the spring, perhaps on May Day.
- iv Event will include student art, music and poetry and refreshments.
- v Deputies will be on site.

C Helping Hands

- 1 Final 2017 Service Day was October 28. We are now on Fall/Winter Break until March.
- 2 The JICHS HOSA club volunteered for the day but did not factor in that SAT testing occurred at the same time.
 - i Two student volunteers, Mark Johnson and Fred Jainchill were able to work on only two properties.
 - ii JICHS students John Jones and Jordan Roop mowed one large corner lot.
 - iii Rondell Scott Lawn Service was hired to take care of all remaining properties at a cost of \$130 paid out of the Helping Hands budget.

- 2 Cathy and Stan Kozikowski obtained refreshments and assisted Inez Brown Crouch in serving refreshments at the event.

 - 2 First issue will be published in the spring.

- B Inez Brown Crouch announced that the History Commission will place an Historic Marker at Pinkney Park on February 10. MB Berry will notify Erin Black so publicity can go out. Inez should send MB details as soon as they are available.
