

Brief History – What is the Greenbelt Program?




November 2004 - Charleston County voters approved levying a half-cent sales tax for transportation improvements and greenspace preservation

\$221 million dedicated to preserving greenspace

Where the Green Goes



Land to Preserve

- Municipalities, etc. team-up with willing property owners
- Greenbelt funds dedicated to the Town \$1,102,130
- Greenbelt funds spent \$200,000
- Greenbelt funds remaining \$902,130
- Property that meets Greenbelt and Public Input criteria identified



Public Input

Charleston County held 3 Public Workshops on the Greenbelt Program in 2005:

Majority of participants: West Ashley, Mt. Pleasant & James Island

- Providing Public Passive Recreational Amenities
- Preservation of Natural Resources and maintaining good quality of life
- Providing safe bicycle/walking trails and paths




- Appraisal Sept 25, 2014 Sass, Herrin & Associates, Inc.

Eligible Costs

- Acquisition of Land or Interests in Land
- Minor improvements limited to:
 - Boardwalks
 - Foot bridges
 - Unpaved trails
 - Unpaved roadways
 - Unpaved parking areas



Application Process

- Pre- Application Meeting
- Application Submission and Staff reviews
- Greenbelt Board reviews
- Parks and Rec Commission recommends for approval
- County Council Considers for Final Approval
- Grant Agreement Executed / Funds dispersed
- Annual Evaluations and Site Visits
